Tips for Preparing your Will

- 1. You must be at least 18 years of age.
- The Will must be prepared free of force or threat.
- 3. You must be of sound mind and have the intention to create the Will when it is being done.
- 4. Your Will must be in writing and be signed by you.
- 5. Your Will must be signed by two witnesses in your presence who saw you sign. Witnesses may be any two persons; however, it is recommended that the witnesses are not beneficiaries or a spouse of a beneficiary.

Jamaica Automobile Association How to Approach A Road Crash

With more than 13,000 people injured annually in road crashes, drivers need to be prepared for the inevitable encounter with a crash site.

"Some common behaviour by those first at crash site can cause additional physical harm to the injured", says Dael Whylie, Marketing and Sales Manager, Jamaica Automobile Association (JAA). The 2017 'Cost of Care Project', reported that half of road traffic crash victims suffered from head and facial injuries, requiring special care in moving them at a crash scene, in case they incur further neck and back injuries.

If an injured person is having breathing difficulties, you may be able to assist by clearing away obstructions from the mouth, such as stones, dirt or dentures, and a clean cloth may be used as a compress to stop the flow of blood from a serious wound.

"Unless the injured person is in danger from fire or oncoming traffic, it is best not to move him or her until adequate help is available", stated Ms Whylie. And, if the vehicle has plunged into a ravine or over a precipice, assess if it is safe for you to assist, and if this is possible, proceed cautiously.

Avoid Clever ATM Theft Scams

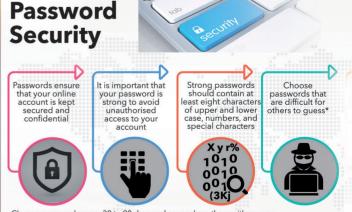
ATM banking technology advances, so do the thieves. You need to know what to look for when next you visit an ATM to withdraw funds.

The JN Security team shares tips to help you to protect your debit card and improve password security.

ATM Security Tip

Thieves are using external devices to confiscate your card. In this scam, a blocking device, which can be as simple as some film glued to trap ATM cards, is inserted into the card slot of the ATM. Often, once your ATM card is trapped, a "Good Samaritan" will show up and offer advice on how to get your card back. He or she may suggest that you enter your Private Identification Number (PIN) a couple of times.

A very common reaction is to go into the bank to report your confiscated card. The thieves then remove the blocking device, along with your trapped ATM card and withdraw money from your account.
