to Westmoreland Building Society

MANDEVILLE, Mr. Feb. 10 (From our correspondent): The Manchester Mutual Building Society has transferred its engagements to Westmoreland Building Society.

A special general meeting of the shareholders of the Manchester Mutual Building Society was held at the Anglican Church Hall, Mandeville, yesterday afternoon.

The purpose of the meeting was for the transfer of all engagements of the Manchester Mutual Building Society to the Westmoreland Building Society to be effective on June 1, 1967.

After open discussions by the directors and shareholders it was decided and the following resolution was unanimously passed:

"Be it resolved that the shareholders of the said society in special general meeting convened for this purpose on February 9, 1967, by two thirds of the whole number of shares in the said society hereby empower the directors thereof to take all steps necessary for the transfer of all engagements and obligations of the said society to the Westmoreland Building Society of Westmoreland effective as from the first day of June 1967. It was generally felt that Manchester could be greatly benefited in the future by the advent of a full branch office to be known as Westmoreland Building Society (Manchester Branch) into the business sector of the parish.

The meeting was presided over by Mr. J. L. Lord, chairman of the society. The directors, Mr. L. P. Delaenha, solicitor, and some 50 members of the society attended the meeting. Also attending were Mr. J. O. Hudson, manager and chairman of the board of directors of the Westmoreland Building Society, Mr. Eric H. Clarke vice-chairman; Mr. K. Calder director and Mr. M. N. Hamaty, solicitor, of the society.
